

## **HOW DOES eADAP WORK?**

Georgia law requires teenagers under the age of 18 to complete the Georgia Alcohol and Drug Awareness Program (ADAP) course to obtain a Class D Provisional Driver's License. ADAP is an instructor-led classroom course taught in the public high schools within this state. Teens unable to take ADAP at their high school due to an absence, scheduling conflict, or homeschooling can complete the eADAP (electronic ADAP) course available on the Georgia Department of Driver Services website (dds.georgia.gov). The steps to register and complete eADAP are below.

## Registration

Students must self-register for eADAP using the following steps:

- **1.** Click <a href="https://online.dds.ga.gov/eadap/studentIndex.aspx">https://online.dds.ga.gov/eadap/studentIndex.aspx</a> and select **Student Registration** in the menu on the left. Click **Continue**.
- **2.** Select the applicable reason for your eADAP enrollment.
- **3.** Type in all information as requested. Make sure to use your legal name (as it appears on your birth certificate) and your personal email address. Click **Save**.
- **4.** After receiving the email with your User ID and password, you have **30 days** to complete the course and three (3) attempts to pass.

NOTE: If you fail to complete eADAP in 30 days, your account will be deactivated and you must request an account reset by submitting an email with your full name, birthdate, User ID, and phone number to <a href="mailto:eADAPsupport@dds.ga.gov">eADAPsupport@dds.ga.gov</a>. If you do not pass eADAP in three (3) attempts, your User ID and password will be disabled and you must re-register to retake the course with a different personal email address.

## **Course Description**

The eADAP course will take approximately 4 hours to complete. You will be able to print your Certificate of Completion by clicking **Print Student Certificate** after successfully passing the course. Before starting the course, please be advised of the following:

- You must complete each module and module guiz before logging out. If not, the module will restart.
- You will not be permitted to complete modules out of order.
- Module guizzes are not graded; a zero (0) will appear on the grade tab.
- Modules are timed. You must retake the module if you attempt to move ahead of the time.
- You may reprint the certificate without logging back in.

Bring a printed copy of your Certificate of Completion to DDS when applying for the Class D Driver's License.

## **Parent ADAP**

DDS provides a second voluntary component for parents or guardians that includes drug prevention tactics, legal accountability information, and other information on safeguarding teens from alcohol and drug use. Your eADAP certificate will contain a certificate # and PIN that your parent or guardian will need to take the Parent ADAP Course. Parents who finish the course can obtain a free 3-year noncertified Motor Vehicle Report (MVR) through DDS Online Services.
